Their contribution to CurePSP will help transform the understanding of this illness.

Our goal is \$1.2 million for the Program. I encouraged the Board to provide 10% of the total (in addition to the \$200 thousand already given by the Peeblers).

I am calling several to discuss joining us on the Major Gifts Committee, and Richard Zyne is putting together the other components to enable funding of this milestone in PSP Research.

We shortly will have in hand the proposal for the Program itself. And our expectation is to have the results in 2008. How great is that?"

Other than that, I will be attending the Valmont Board meeting in Omaha and the Meredith Board meeting in New York next month. I am hoping to stay over a couple of extra night in NYC to spend time with Todd and David and his family.

We have a full house this Easter week with the grandchildren, Mark, David & Dyan. Todd could not make the trip due to his new job at FireBrand TV. Everything seems to be routine, but good. I love my new patio that Toni designed for us. We are putting the house in Hailey on the market due to my health. I am unable to take as full advantage of Idaho life like I used to.
